
During the March and April RAC meetings we committed to providing you the several things. We have compiled the list of action items to include:

- Accounts Receivable for ADP Customers
- Qualified Census Tracts
- Energy Burden for CPS Energy Customers
- Deposit requirements for new customers
- Agency Partners
- Expanded Energy Angels Program

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE FOR ADP CUSTOMERS

As of December 31, 2022, 53% of our ADP customers are current on their energy bills. Of the remaining 47% that are past due (accounts more than 30 days old), 27% are on an installment plan, 8% are not on an installment plan and 12% are eligible for disconnect.






QUALIFIED CENSUS TRACTS

A Qualified Census Tract (QCT) is any census tract (or equivalent geographic area defined by the Census Bureau) in which at least 50% of households have an income less than 60% of the Area Median Gross Income (AMGI)¹

There are currently 94 QCT's in our service territory as of December 2022. Approximately 58,000, or 50% of our customers that live in QCT's are Energy Burdened as shown below:


ENERGY BURDEN FOR CPS ENERGY CUSTOMERS

Energy Burden is defined as:



The numerator is the total of the actual billed consumption and service availability charges, for both electric and gas. The denominator is the annual income purchased from an external data source.

For calendar year 2022, we calculated the Energy Burden for each of our customers. We acquired approximately 80-85% of our customers income for these calculations. There are ~140,000 customers in our service territory that have an Energy Burden of higher than 6%. The map below shows the largest number of customers are in zip codes 78228 and 78207.



Below are the top ten zip codes showing 60,000 of the 126,000, or 48% of our customers are Energy Burdened Customers.

Some of the other insights we observed are as follows:

Average Age: 50- 55 years

Average Usage: 1,371 kWh

Average Bill: \$137

Average Income: \$20 - \$25k

DEPOSIT REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW CUSTOMERS

Generally, all new customers may be required to pay a deposit*. That deposit is typically an estimate of two months' energy usage based on the property or type of service.

If documentation of any of the following can be provided, a deposit requirement may be waived: proof of previous timely utility payments; active-duty military service; or certain special conditions**.

Customers who have previously defaulted or have been involved with meter tampering will be required to resolve any outstanding unpaid debts through repayment or be placed on an approved, deferred payment plan.

Customers who have been issued a disconnect notice may be asked to pay an additional deposit.

If there are no missing payments or collection activity including late fees or disconnections, deposits are typically refunded to residential customers after roughly 12 consecutive months of on-time payments, and to commercial customers after 24 months. Additionally, there must be no "Past Due" bill currently owed for the service account(s) or on any other related account, and no other monies must be owed.

Security deposits and/or other amounts owed will be refunded by crediting a monthly bill or in a manner consistent with our current processes. Deposits are refunded to the account upon either successful payments as specified or in the case of default to offset any unpaid, outstanding balance at the time of account closure. In the case of successful payments, the customer may request a check refund of their deposit; otherwise, it will be applied as a credit against future bills.

To assist with the challenge of customers having to come up with a deposit, many utilities have leveraged pre-pay billing options that do not require a deposit.
